Girls

Business Meetings (first meeting of the month, excluding initiation and installation)

- Dress or skirts
 - More than two (2) inches below the end of the fingertips
 - O Slits no higher than two (2) inches above the knee
 - Jean skirts need to be neatly pressed and tasteful
 - Back of dresses no lower than natural bra line
 - o Tights/Leggings allowed underneath skirts or dresses of appropriate length
 - Slip appropriate length (nobody likes to see through your dress/skirt)
- Light colored undergarments (not visible through clothing)
- Assembly/Grand Assembly polos
- Dress Slacks
 - o Navy, black, khaki colored (including but not limited to those colors)
 - Neat, pressed, loose fitting (preferably with a crease)
- No jeans, cargo pants, leggings, stretch pants, sweatpants, etc.
- Hair out of the face without pieces flying all over for formal Grand Assembly activities and Introductions

Tattoos

- All tattoos must be properly covered at all Rainbow functions
 - o This is a Supreme Assembly rule that must be followed at all times

<u>Jewelry</u>


- Earrings no longer than 1½ inches from top to bottom
- Body piercings must be covered (excluding earrings)
- Small nose studs and flush nostril rings are allowed
- No septal piercings

Shoes

- No clogs (crocs), flip-flops, sneakers
- Heels
 - No taller than four (4) inches
 - O Soles under ball of foot no taller than one (1) inch
- Dress boots okay to wear with dress pants, dresses, skirts and blouses
- Open toed dress sandals must have back strap and good nail etiquette followed

Assembly Polos/Rainbow T-Shirts

- Worn for parades and serving a Masonic family dinner
- Anywhere else where you are making an impression



Initiation and Installation

- White floor length gowns
 - Neatly pressed for officers, choir, and Mother Advisor
 - No trains
 - O Slim enough to walk through bow stations without knocking anything over
 - Back does not fall below natural bra line
 - All undergarment straps are covered
 - No visible cleavage
 - Straps
 - At least one (1) inch wide at the narrowest part
 - No spaghetti straps or strapless
 - O White, silver, gold, or nude shoes (no clogs, sneakers, flip-flops)
 - White or skin toned nylons, or dress socks
- Brag rags
 - Only Rainbow items
 - Must not "clank" while you walk
- Candidates
 - An appropriate dress of any color (excluding black and very dark colors)

Grand Family

- Grand Officers and JGEC
 - Hair out of the face without pieces flying all over for formal Grand Assembly activities and Introductions
- Grand Representatives
 - Wear Grand Representative badge from GWA at all meetings (including your own Assembly's formal meetings)

Fun Assembly Activities - Rainbow Casual

- Pants or shorts
 - Fingertip length or longer
 - Clean, in good taste, no holes

Social Activities - formal

- Colored gowns
 - o Floor, tea, knee length
 - Of any color (excluding all black)
- Grand Assembly Banquet/Charity Ball
 - Spaghetti straps or strapless is allowed
 - No cleavage showing
 - No open mid-drifts

Prospect events

- Rainbow T-shirt
- Appropriate length skirt or pants

Swimwear

- One or two piece
- In good taste and not revealing
- In hotels and other facilities
 - o Cover-ups and appropriate shoes must be worn when going to and from the pool

 - Undergarments must be covered

 - No open mid-drifts

- Rainbow T-shirt

- Jacket is optional

If you have to ask if something is appropriate, chances are it isn't

General Rules for Girls and Adults

Hair should be neat and out of the face

• "Side bangs" should be out of the face

Minimal jewelry and make-up

Nails should be clean and trimmed

No chipped polish

Tops and dresses should not show cleavage

Slips and appropriate colored undergarments should be worn

"Brag rags" and jewelry should not clank when you walk

Must be formally attired to be introduced
